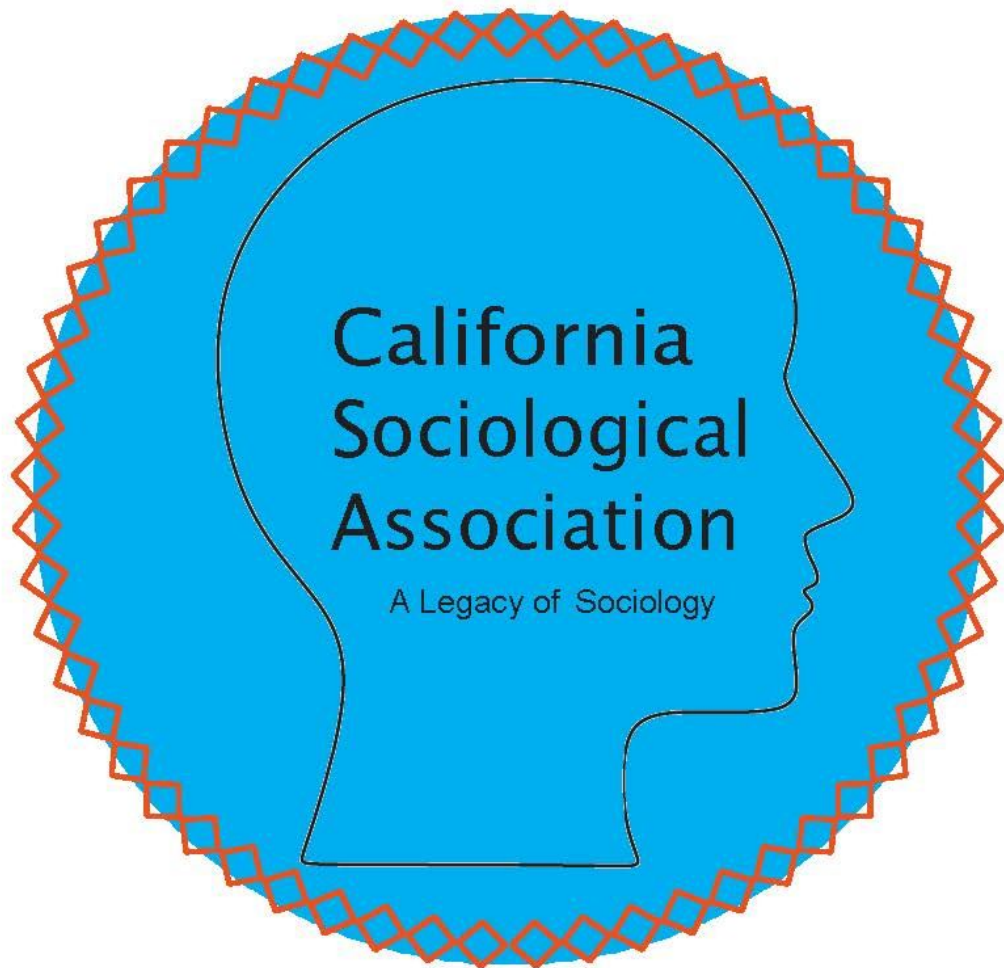

Keynote Speaker: G. William Domhoff, University of California, Santa Cruz



Building on the conference theme of “A Legacy of Sociology,” the keynote presentation by G. William Domhoff, “*Who Rules America?* and Power Structure Research: Legacies of the Sixties? Or Relics?,” will discuss the flowering of power structure research amidst the activism of the 1960s and its aftermath. It will use the occasion of the fiftieth anniversary of *Who Rules America?* (1967) to reflect on the future of power structure research.

G. William Domhoff is Distinguished Professor Emeritus and Research Professor at the University of California, Santa Cruz, where he has taught since 1965 after three years at California State University, Los Angeles. In addition to *Who Rules America? The Triumph of the Corporate Rich*, Seventh Edition (McGraw-Hill 2014), he has most recently written *The Myth of Liberal Ascendancy: Corporate Dominance from the Great Depression to the Great Recession* (Routledge 2013). Along with eleven other authors, he is a co-author of *Studying the Power Elite: Fifty Years of Who Rules America?* (Routledge, 2018), which is due out in November, and also the co-author with Richard L. Zweigenhaft of the forthcoming *Diversity in the Power Elite: Ironies and Unfulfilled Promises* (Rowman and Littlefield 2018).
