CSA 2023 Keynote Speaker



Dr. Melina Abdullah on “Why White Supremacy is Afraid of Black Studies”

Dr. Melina Abdullah is Professor and former Chair of Pan-African Studies at California State University Los Angeles. She earned her Ph.D. and M.A. from the University of Southern California in Political Science and her B.A. from Howard University in African American Studies. She was appointed to the Los Angeles County Human Relations Commission in 2014 and is a recognized expert on race, gender, class, and social movements. Dr. Abdullah is the author of numerous articles and book chapters, with subjects ranging from political coalition building to womanist mothering.

Dr. Abdullah is a womanist scholar-activist—understanding the role that she plays in the academy as intrinsically linked to broader struggles for the liberation of oppressed people. She is a leader in the fight for Ethnic Studies in the K-12 and university systems and was a part of the historic victory that made Ethnic Studies a requirement in the Los Angeles Unified School District. She was among the original group of organizers that convened to form Black Lives Matter and continues to serve as a Los Angeles chapter lead and contributes to the national leadership. Dr. Abdullah is co-host and co-producer of the weekly radio program Beautiful Struggle, which airs on KPFK, part of the Pacifica radio network. She also serves on boards for the Black Community, Clergy and Labor Alliance (BCCLA), California Faculty Association-Los Angeles, Los Angeles African American Women’s Public Policy Institute, Los Angeles Community Action Network (LA-CAN), National Association for Ethnic Studies, Reverence-Wellness Salon, and Strategic Concepts in Organizing and Policy Education (SCOPE).

Dr. Abdullah is the recipient of many awards, most recently the 2016 Racial Justice Award presented by the YWCA, the 2016 Fannie Lou Hamer Award for outstanding community service presented by the Coalition of Mental Health Professionals, 2016 Fannie Lou Hamer Award presented by the National Conference of Black Political Scientists, 2016 Sacred Sistahs Award, 2016 California Teachers Association Human Rights Award, 2016 BCCLA Ella Baker Award, 2015 Freedom Now Award, and the 2015 Communitas Award. She was recognized by LA Weekly as one of the 10 most influential Los Angeles leaders, “Urban Girl of the Year” by 2UrbanGirls, and one of the 15 “Fiercest Sisters” of 2015 by Fierce. Dr. Abdullah has appeared on MSNBC, CNN, TV One, ABC, PBS, KTLA, KCET, BET, Free Speech TV, and Al-Jazeera, and is featured in the films 13th, When Justice Isn’t Just, and Justice or Else. She is originally from Oakland, California. Dr. Abdullah is a single “soccer mama” of three children and resides in Mid-City Los Angeles.

Remembering Zahieb Mwongozi

On June 19, 2023, I attended the funeral of Zahieb Mwongozi (aka Craig L. Erving, Rev. Craig Erving, Craig 17X, and Ali Baba). It was held on Monday, June 19, 2023 at Mount Olive Christian Deliverance Center in Oakland, California at 2000 40th Avenue. After the funeral, the committal service and burial took place in Rolling Hills Memorial Park. It is a cemetery located in Richmond, California at 4100 Hilltop Drive.

Zahieb, a native of Oakland, was a dear friend of mine since 1981 when he performed the lead role in Marvin X's play *In the Name of Love*. I wrote a review of the play for the *Grassroots: Berkeley's Community Newspaper* in Berkeley, California wherein I said that Zahieb delivered an outstanding performance and reminded me of a young Glynn Turman. Zahieb was truly a renaissance man who made outstanding contributions as an actor, poet, musician, recording artist, journalist, African dancer, paralegal, ordained minister, and instructional assistant. For example, Zahieb was the author of a wonderful collection of poetry titled *Waterpipe Dreams*; founder of Beacon Community Outreach as a ministry of the Universal Life Church; founder of Beacon Family and Community Law Advocates; founder of Imperative Media Matrix; and founder of Imperative Records. Under the aegis of Imperative Media Matrix, Zahieb published an online journal of poetry named *The Poet's Bench*.

As he engaged in many other interests, Zahieb also served a stint as an instructional assistant to me in the Sociology Department at Contra Costa College. In addition, Zahieb was a griot of the Hip Hop Movement who knew intimate details about its history and served as one of the primary interviewees for the 2018 article I wrote regarding that social movement for *Africology: The Journal of Pan African Studies*. If there is one word that reflects the essence of my dearly departed friend Zahieb, it is "self-determination." Zahieb will be sorely missed by his friends, clients, and family—especially his two daughters who he loved deeply.
